GREETINGS FROM THE PORT EDWARDS POLICE DEPARTMENT!

We would like to congratulate Lt. Chuck Lamb on his retirement! Lt. Lamb served the Village of Port Edwards proudly for 15 years. He previously served with the Town of Rome Police Department for 14 years. His dedication to the profession and to the people that he served was second to none. Although he is retired, he assures me that he will still be seen throughout the Village, walking Bobo (his dog) and welcomes everyone to stop and say, "Hello."

Officer Brandon Abbott started with the police department in September 2019 and comes to us with a 20year law enforcement background. Please make sure to welcome him to our Port Edwards family.

With Spring right around the corner, we would like to remind everyone to make sure that you are following the village ordinances. The Police Department will be working with the Public Works Department to try to

"clean up" our community and will be issuing warnings and citations if compliance is not gained. If you have questions about the ordinances, you can find them on the village website, or you may call or stop by the police department to discuss.

Some of the ordinances that have been problematic are:

- 10.06 JUNK, CERTAIN VEHICLES AND FIREWOOD
- (3) STORAGE OF INOPERABLE VEHICLES, ETC.



(a) <u>Restricted</u>. No person shall accumulate, store or allow any disassembled, inoperable, junked or wrecked motor vehicles, truck bodies, tractors or trailers in the open upon any public or private property in the Village for a period exceeding 10 days.

- (4) STORAGE OF UNLICENSED VEHICLES, ETC.
 - (a) <u>Restricted</u>. No person shall accumulate, store or allow any unlicensed motor vehicle, truck body, tractor or trailer in the open upon any public or private property in the Village for a period exceeding 10 days.

11.02 GARBAGE AND REFUSE COLLECTION.

(2) COLLECTION TIME AND DAYS. Except as provided in sub. (5) below, garbage and refuse shall be placed in approved containers or bundles and placed at the curb or roadside by 7:00 A.M. on the scheduled day. After collection, containers shall be removed from the curb or roadside within 12 hours. No pickup shall be made on legal holidays, but shall be made the previous or following workday

(note pickup times have changed, so placing the containers at the curb or roadside the evening prior will be allowed) ***(the containers should be at the curb or roadside by **6:00 A.M.** on the scheduled day)***

I would also like to thank everyone who has welcomed me in my new role as Chief of Police. I am very excited about the future of the Police Department and for the future of our great Village!

NOTES FROM THE FIRE CHIEF'S DESK

It's that time of the year again. I know this has been a long, hard winter and, with the amount of snow that we received this year, that we all can't wait for spring to arrive. We would like to say thank you to the residents who adopted a Fire Hydrant. We didn't need any of them "thank God" but if we did this would've helped us a lot.

Here are some dates for upcoming events at the station. Our members are trying to be proactive and do more public safety work with our neighbors. Please stop down and meet our members and say "Hi."

Saturday May 2nd from 9:00 am - 2:30 pm Kids Safety Fair& Bike Rodeo at the Fire Station- This will be run in conjunction with the Port Edwards Police Department and the Law Enforcement Club from the High School. We will be having demonstrations going on during this time. Please stop down and join us.

Saturday May 16th from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm Village wide garage sale, we will be hosting an Open House and Brat Fry fundraiser- Stop down to enjoy some food and say "Hello."

Friday June 19th from 5:00 pm – 11:30 pm Port Edwards Street Dance featuring the band, Road Trip- This will be held at the station and is our biggest fundraiser. There will be food, drink and door prizes. If you see one of our Firefighters remember to ask them about our raffle tickets. Please stop down and support your local Fire Department.

Remember to control your campfires and make sure they are out cold before leaving them unattended. If you burn brush, make sure to get a permit. In the village you can only burn in nonresidential areas between the hours of 6pm and midnight. No burning is allowed on Sundays or holidays. Below is the portion of the village ordinance pertaining to open burning:

[5.14 OPEN BURNING REGULATED.

(1) PROHIBITED BURNING. It shall be unlawful to burn leaves and trash of any kind.

(2) RECREATIONAL BURNING. Open recreational burning is permitted in a fire pit; a minimum 3-sided enclosure; or a gas, electric or charcoal kettle, subject to the following:

(a) The fire is monitored by a responsible person until the fire is extinguished or burns out.

(b) The fire is not lit on windy days or when atmospheric conditions will endanger the public health or safety.

(c) The fire is located off the public right of way and in excess of 30 feet from the residence of another.

(d) The fire is not used for the covert burning of plastic, rubber, garbage or other offensive materials.

(3) BURNING BY PERMIT. Burning permits for burning brush in nonresidential areas may be issued by the Fire Chief. Burning permits for residential areas may be approved by the Village Board.

(4) LIABILITY. Any person open burning, whether permitted or not, which results in a response by the Village Fire Department shall be billed for the cost of such response.

We are looking for new members who would like to serve the community as a firefighter or first responder. It is a commitment, but it is well worth it. If you are interested, please stop down and let's talk.

As to Village business: The Village President stated that our Public Work Superintend has scheduled two alley projects, whereby 2-inch water main will be replaced with new 6-inch mains for this summer construction season. The alley segments are between Lavigne Avenue and Washington Avenue and Washington Avenue, running from 1st Street to 2nd Street. You may have already seen surveyors on site getting ready to have plans designed. The plan in this project is to have little interruption in water service and grade changes to match all driveways off the alleys. Before construction begins, the property owners affected by this project will be contacted.

Thanks to Robb Sigler and the Nekoosa Port Edwards State Bank, the underground sprinkling system was a real boost to making the gardens successful. The Memorial Board is up and ready for name plaques that can be purchased in honor or in memory of loved ones, including pets. There is an order form attached to this newsletter.

Last May, the fourth graders and their teachers, Mrs. Bogdan and Mr. Martin, planted roughly 96 bulbs that they got from Mrs. Doran's class. They planted them in groupings of 3 and 4 in the bed closest to the alley and 3rd Street. So, be watching for the blooms this spring.

We are hoping to be able to get some sort of a gazebo constructed at the park this summer. We are accepting donations to make this happen. Spring Cleanup

The Village takes pride in being a very clean community. Residents expect the Village government to enforce the rules when it comes to garbage, clutter, and vehicles.

Please remember:

- Garbage, appliances, clutter, etc. is not permitted to be left in public view.
- Campers, boats, etc. must be parked and stored BEHIND or ALONG SIDE of houses. They are not allowed to be parked in front of the house or on the street other than for actual loading or unloading.
- DOG FECES IS NOT YARD WASTE. Raking dog feces into grass piles for the village crew to pick up will not be tolerated. Residents doing so will be referred to the Police Department.

Leaf, Grass and Brush Pickup

As the winter ends and we start to get outside again, please remember the following:

On a weekly basis, the crew will pick up grass that is **properly** placed. Typically grass pickup is on Mondays and Tuesdays.

PLEASE NOTE: Brush will be picked up on the same week as recycling.

Please be conscientious when placing waste at the curb. Be sure no foreign objects, such as stones, metal, etc. are mixed in with the waste. One piece of metal can completely ruin a \$300 set of chipper blades. Repairing equipment takes time and money and results in delays in picking up waste so PLEASE BE CAREFUL.

- All brush and grass must be placed on the boulevard area behind the curb.
- Grass and leaves must be placed separate from brush.
- Brush must be stacked neatly with the cut end facing the street.
- Roots must be removed and placed separately from the branches.

The Village generates many tons of compostable material each year. If you need compost or wood chips, please contact the Municipal Building to arrange delivery of the material. Delivery is free to Village residents.

Shelter Reservations

Reservations for the Ripple Creek Park outside shelter and Edwards-Alexander Memorial Park enclosed and outside shelters can be made by calling the Municipal Building at 715-887-3512.

Current prices for using the Enclosed Shelter are:

- Resident fee without kitchen \$100.00
- Resident fee with kitchen \$125.00
- Non-resident fee without kitchen \$125.00
- Non-resident fee with kitchen \$150.00

A \$25.00 refund will be issued if the building is left clean.

Residents can reserve the outside shelters free of charge while non-residents are charged \$35.00.

Garbage and Recycling

Please remember to place your weekly garbage and bi-weekly recyclables out for curbside pickup by **6:00 AM** each day of pickup. <u>Also</u> remember that the day for pickup is Wednesday. Garbage &



Recyclables must fit in the bin with the lid closed. **Please note that pizza boxes are not recyclable.** If you experience less than satisfactory service or if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to give us a call at the Municipal Building, 715-887-3512.

Street Lights

The Village makes every effort to ensure that all the street lights in town are working but we need your help. Please let us know anytime you notice a street light that is not working or not working properly. If you have internet access, you can also report street light outages directly to Alliant Energy. Go to *alliantenergy.com* and at the top of the page select *Customer Service;* then *Storm and Outage Center*. Then select *Report an Electric Outage* and fill in the required information. Billing: Bills for water service are rendered quarterly and become due upon issuance following the period for which service is rendered. A late payment charge of 3 percent but not less than 50 cents will be added to bills not paid within 20 days of issuance. This one-time 3 percent late payment charge will be applied to any unpaid balance for the current billing period's usage. This late payment charge is applicable to all customers. The utility customer may be given a written notice that the bill is overdue no sooner than 20 days after the bill is issued, and, unless payment or satisfactory arrangement for payment is made within the next ten days, service may be disconnected pursuant to Chapter PSC 185, WI Admin. Code.

Wastewater Rate Increase

Rates increased on January 1, 2020. Please note that you will see this increase on the April 1, 2020 billing.
