<u>Leaf Pick-up</u>

It is again that time of year for leaves. Due to the tremendous quantity of leaves put out in just a short time, please remember to place leaves in the gutter section of the street in a long row along your property. Only leaves may be placed along the gutter and please note that this is the only time of the year that anything can be placed in the gutter.

Separated piles of brush and grass must be placed on the boulevard area behind the curb and the brush must be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the street. Also, roots must be removed from the brush and placed separately from the branches.

If you follow these rules, your leaves and other yard waste will be picked up in a timely manner.

Hydrant Flushing


Fall hydrant flushing will take place on **Sept. 22**nd **& 23**rd. Please be aware that there may be some dirty water during this time.

FALL/WINTER NEWS THE FIRE CHIEF'S DESK

The seasons are changing again. Fall and winter are around the corner so here are a few thoughts. With fall coming these are some things you should be thinking: Fire prevention week is October $4^{th} - 10^{th}$. This is a real good time to change your batteries in your smoke detectors and make sure they are operating properly. The Law is one smoke detector minimum per floor and this also goes for carbon monoxide detectors. These two things have been proven to save lives. This is also a great time to go over your escape plan with your children if you have them; if not, still go over your plan with two routes out of your home.

If you burn wood in your home, please have your chimney cleaned and inspected yearly. We really don't want to come to your home and make a mess.

With winter coming the snow and cold weather will be here soon so please remember to keep all your furnace vents on your home clear of snow. This is a big reason why fire departments are called to homes - Carbon monoxide detectors going off or people feeling sick. It only takes a minute to check.

At this time, I would like to ask everyone a big favor - please help us out during the winter and the snow season. If you have a fire hydrant by your home or even close, could you please keep it cleaned out for us? This saves a lot of time if we need to use it; for every minute a fire burns it doubles in size. It is recommended a 3foot by 3foot area around the hydrant to be cleared. This gives us the area we need to do our job if needed.

At the station we are moving forward. We had 10 firefighters complete their Officer 1 class and I am very proud of them. The amount of time that it takes to be a volunteer is unbelievable. The requirements are the same as full time departments, and they are doing this part time. We also just had three of our firefighters start their EMR (first responder) classes and one who has started his EMT basic class.

Things are moving forward at the Station and we are looking for new members, Membership doesn't have be everything. If you are interested in say, just the EMS side of it, come down and let's talk. We now have a fillable application online at the Village of Port Edwards web site under the tab employment. Please print it off and drop it off at the Municipal Building or email it to me at PEFD.Chief@port-edwards.org This is a commitment that is well worth it. Serve and get to know your community.

2020 has really thrown all of us a curve ball. We have been dealing with COVID and everyone is on edge. We are working thru all of the trying times and still taking care of the business at hand.

BEWARE OF THE CORONA SCAMS

Scammers are individuals who commit fraud or participate in a dishonest scheme. They prey on the weak, desperate, and vulnerable and use times of crisis for their advantage. Since the Coronavirus Pandemic there has been more than 170,000 reported complaints for scams. The reports indicate that the scammers have been using the topics of masks, face shields, cures for the coronavirus, COVID-19 test results, antibody test results, stimulus payments, and unemployment via telephone or email to obtain personal and financial information for identity theft or health insurance scams. So far, there has been more than \$114 million dollars lost to coronavirus fraud according to the Federal Trade Commission.

TIPS TO AVOIS CORONAVIRUS SCAMS

- Avoid online offers for coronavirus-related vaccines or cures; they are not legitimate.
- Be wary of emails, calls and social media posts advertising "free" or government-ordered COVID-19 tests. Check the FDA website for a list of approved tests and testing companies.
- Do not click on links or download files from unexpected emails, even if the email address looks like a company or person you recognize. Ditto for text messages and unfamiliar websites.
- Do not share personal information such as Social Security, Medicare and credit card numbers in response to an unsolicited call, text or email.
- Be skeptical of fundraising calls or emails for COVID-19 victims or virus research, especially if they
 pressure you to act fast and request payment by prepaid debit cards or gift cards.
- Ignore phone calls or emails from strangers urging you to invest in a hot new coronavirus stock.

 MOST IMPORTIANTLY, NEVER GIVE OUT PERSONAL INFORMATION SUCH AS SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR BANK ACCOUNT NUMBERS TO STRANGERS!!!! YOU HAVE WORKED LONG AND HARD FOR YOUR IDENTITY AND MONEY, DO NOT GIVE IT ALL AWAY IN A PHONE CALL OR EMAIL!

Port Edwards Water Utility Rates

The Public Service Commission requires that water rates be published semi-annually. The following rates took effect on September 5, 2018:

Quarterly Service Charge:

Plus Volume Charge:

First 25,000 cubic feet used each quarter - \$1.31 per 100 cubic feet Next 375,000 cubic feet used each quarter - \$1.17 per 100 cubic feet Over 400,000 cubic feet used each quarter - \$0.87 per 100 cubic feet

Quarterly Service Charge for Sprinkling Meter:

5/8" meter - \$ 5.40 1" meter - \$ 10.50 1 ½" meter - \$ 21.00 2" meter - \$ 28.00



Billing: Bills for water service are rendered quarterly and become due upon issuance following the period for which service is rendered. A late payment charge of 3 percent but not less than 50 cents will be added to bills not paid within 20 days of issuance. This one time 3 percent late payment charge will be applied to any unpaid balance for the current billing period's usage. This late payment charge is applicable to all customers. The utility customer may be given a written notice that the bill is overdue no sooner than 20 days after the bill is issued, and unless payment or satisfactory arrangement for payment is made within the next ten days, service may be disconnected pursuant to Chapter PSC 185, WI Admin. Code.
