### **VILLAGE TRUSTEE CANDIDATES**

#### ERIK D. SAYLOR - INCUMBENT

My name is Erik Saylor and I am once again asking for your vote to represent you, on our Village Board. I have been an elected trustee on the Village Board since 2015. I do not hold any personal agendas and my intentions are solely to represent the residents and be a good steward of public tax dollars because of my commitment to our Village. My name is Caleb McGregor, 33. I bring to the Port Edwards Village Board several positive qualities.



#### FROM THE DESK OF THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR



Howdee residents of The Village of Port Edwards. Greetings from your Village Administrator, Raymond "Boz" Bossert. All goes well in our Village and I am excited about the challenges ahead. Again, I start each day by reaffirming, "what can we do today to make Port Edwards the best it can be". Trust me we are making progress.

We are weathering thru another Winter season and it has been very interesting. Not a lot of snow, very cold weather and some unique storms in December, but all is well. We are in the ending stages of the COVID pandemic and have peaked at our vaccination rate, the numbers are stabilizing and we are trying to

get back to normal. The end is in sight. The Vaccine is flowing out and at the time of this newsletter, over 70% of our Village will have received the vaccine. In the end, like I mentioned in my State of the Village report in December, we have come thru this better and stronger as a community and I thank each and every one of you for your support to make that happen.

Now onto Village Business.... We have approved and are executing our 2022 Budget. All looks good. We will bring in about \$4.7 Million dollars annually in revenue and this year's budget we planned to expend about \$3.7 million. The difference is kept in our Reserves. To address a recurring question that I have received, yes, the Village started its Wheel infrastructure fee on your registration forms. This will impact all owners of vehicles in the village. A reminder, tied to this the Village removed all Special Assessments for the future (existing assessments will be paid off). We have also directed these monies to go directly to a street project, not the general fund. This should be looked at as a reduction in your potential costs as a taxpayer, especially since the assessments were removed.

We will be taking on some major infrastructure projects this year. We plan to complete the rebuild of our 3<sup>rd</sup> street from Edwards Ave to Morrill. We also plan to resurface our 4<sup>th</sup> street from Bruener to Seneca road, as well as resurfacing Port and Seneca Roads. There will be some minor alley repairs. Depending on the federal funds that come our way we may increase some other projects in the Village, but more to follow. We will as usual repair about 1000' feet of curb and gutter as well as sidewalks throughout the spring and summer. We continue to improve our parks and we hopefully will have a ribbon cutting on our New Dog park in late Spring, more to follow. We continue to make progress with DMI and the Old Mill property and hope to unveil some development plans for the site. We will also start our dialogue with the NEPCO lake residents planning for the Boundary agreement to end in a few years. Those 200+ residents will return back to the Village in 2 years and we hope to make that a seamless and positive transition.

It continues to be my goal to make this a very *Professional, Ready and Relevant* Village staff. We have numerous challenges ongoing and ahead that we all need to work together to overcome. Our Village services need the right investment to support all our residents and businesses in Port Edwards. We must be good stewards of our tax funds and choose wisely on investments and budgets. The best use of tax funds and service fees are only amplified when we have resident "buy in" on our initiatives and projects. I look forward to working on these issues together moving forward.

I am excited to be here and look forward to the challenges. Let's get to work and stay "PORT PROUD!"

Warm weather is quickly approaching, and most everyone will be doing yardwork and probably still cleaning up after our big windstorm in December. Please exercise caution when burning any brush or debris. I drive around and see all the downed trees and fallen branches which is terrific fuel for wildfires. So please be careful when doing yardwork during those warm, dry, breezy spring days. If you burn brush be sure to get a permit. No burning is allowed on Sundays or holidays. Below is the Village ordinance pertaining to open burning.

#### [5.14 OPEN BURNING REGULATED.

- (1) PROHIBITED BURNING. It shall be unlawful to burn leaves and trash of any kind.
- (2) RECREATIONAL BURNING. Open recreational burning is permitted in a fire pit; a minimum 3-sided enclosure; or a gas, electric or charcoal kettle, subject to the following:
- (a) The fire is monitored by a responsible person until the fire is extinguished or burns out.
- (b) The fire is not lit on windy days or when atmospheric conditions will endanger the public health or safety.
- (c) The fire is located off the public right of way and more than 30 feet from the residence of another.
- (d) The fire is not used for the covert burning of plastic, rubber, garbage, or other offensive materials.
- (3) BURNING BY PERMIT. Burning permits for burning brush in nonresidential areas may be issued by the Fire Chief. Burning permits for residential areas may be approved by the Village Board.
- (4) LIABILITY. Any person open burning, whether permitted or not, which results in a response by the Village Fire Department shall be billed for the cost of such response.

Volunteer departments all need more members. If you're interested in helping people, helping your community, and making a bunch of friends, please reach out and join your local fire dept. It's very rewarding, you'll be happy you did.

#### GREETINGS FROM THE PORT EDWARDS POLICE DEPARTMENT!

Do you or someone you live with have a condition that you would like Emergency Responders to know about?

The Port Edwards Police Department is excited to announce that we will be offering alert stickers for people who are mentally or physically disabled, deaf or hard of hearing, have dementia or alzheimers, or have autism spectrum disorder. These will be provided free of charge while supplies last.

You may pick up your stickers at the Port Edwards Police Department, Port Edwards Municipal Building or by emailing scott.drew@portedwardswi.gov

We would recommend placing an alert sticker at all entry doors, so it is visible for all Emergency Responders.

Availability is not limited to Port Edwards residents.

With spring right around the corner, we want to remind everyone that our streets, sidewalks, and parks will soon be filled with everyone enjoying the warm weather. Please make sure that you are courteous and watch for pedestrians while driving.

Also, with the warmer weather approaching, we would like to remind everyone to make sure that you are following the village ordinances. The Police Department will be working with the

Public Works Department to try to "clean up" our community and will be issuing warnings and citations if compliance is not gained. If you have questions about the ordinances, you can find them on the village website, or you may call or stop by the police department to discuss.

We continue to have problems with junk, animal feces, vehicles, and other unsightly items in yards; please do your part to make our community beautiful. Citations start at \$124.00 and can be issued for every day that the problem is not corrected.

With tax time upon us, please watch for tax related scams. Use only reputable tax preparers and keep your private information private. Never share your information over the phone especially if you receive an unsolicited call. If you believe you have been victimized by a scam, you can visit IdentityTheft.gov for guidance, or contact the police department and we can assist you with the situation.

#### **Spring Cleanup**

The Village takes pride in being a very clean community. Residents expect the Village government to enforce the rules when it comes to garbage, clutter, and vehicles. Please remember:

- Garbage, appliances, clutter, etc. is not permitted to be left in public view.
- Campers, boats, etc. must be parked and stored BEHIND or ALONG SIDE of houses. They are not allowed to be parked in front of the house or on the street other than for actual loading or unloading.
- DOG FECES IS NOT YARD WASTE. Raking dog feces into grass piles for the village crew to pick up will not be tolerated. Residents doing so will be referred to the Police Department.

#### **Leaf, Grass and Brush Pickup**

As the winter ends and we start to get outside again, please remember the following:

On a weekly basis, the crew will pick up grass that is **properly** placed. Typically grass pickup is on Mondays and Tuesdays.

## PLEASE NOTE: Brush will be picked up on the same week as recycling.

Please be conscientious when placing waste at the curb. Be sure no foreign objects, such as stones, metal, etc. are mixed in with the waste. One piece of metal can completely ruin a \$300 set of chipper blades. Repairing equipment takes time and money and results in delays in picking up waste so PLEASE BE CAREFUL.

- All brush and grass must be placed on the boulevard area behind the curb.
- Grass and leaves must be placed separate from brush.
- Brush must be stacked neatly with the cut end facing the street.
- Roots must be removed and placed separately from the branches.

The Village generates many tons of compostable material each year. If you need compost or wood chips, please contact the Municipal Building to arrange delivery of the material. Delivery is free to Village residents.

#### **Shelter Reservations**

Reservations for the Ripple Creek Park outside shelter and Edwards-Alexander Memorial Park enclosed and outside shelters can be made by calling the Municipal Building at 715-887-3512.

Current prices for using the Enclosed Shelter are:

Resident fee without kitchen \$100.00
Resident fee with kitchen \$125.00
Non-resident fee without kitchen \$125.00
Non-resident fee with kitchen \$150.00

A \$25.00 refund will be issued if the building is left clean.

Residents can reserve the outside shelters free of charge while non-residents are charged \$35.00.

#### **Garbage and Recycling**

Please remember to place your weekly garbage and bi-weekly recyclables out for curbside pickup by 6:00

AM each day of pickup. Also remember that the day for pickup is

Wednesday. Garbage & Recyclables

must fit in the bin with the lid closed. Please note that pizza boxes are not recyclable. If you experience less than satisfactory service or if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to give us a call at the Municipal Building, 715-887-3512.

**Street Lights** 

The Village makes every effort to ensure that all the street lights in town are working but we need your help. Please let us know anytime you notice a street light that is not working or not working properly. Billing: Bills for water service are rendered quarterly and become due upon issuance following the period for which service is rendered. A late payment charge of 3 percent but not less than 50 cents will be added to bills not paid within 20 days of issuance. This one-time 3 percent late payment charge will be applied to any unpaid balance for the current billing period's usage. This late payment charge is applicable to all customers. The utility customer may be given a written notice that the bill is overdue no sooner than 20 days after the bill is issued, and unless payment or satisfactory arrangement for payment is made within the next ten days, service may be disconnected pursuant to Chapter PSC 185, WI Admin. Code.
