## <u>Leaf Pick-up</u>

It is again that time of year for leaves. Due to the tremendous quantity of leaves put out in just a short time, please remember to place leaves in the gutter section of the street in a long row along your property. <u>Only leaves may be placed along the gutter</u> and please note that <u>this is the only time of</u> <u>the year that anything can be placed in the</u> <u>gutter</u>.

Separated piles of brush and grass must be placed on the boulevard area behind the curb and the brush must be stacked neatly with the cut ends facing the street. Also, roots must be removed from the brush and placed separately from the branches.

If you follow these rules, your leaves and other yard waste will be picked up in a timely manner.

## FROM THE DESK OF THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR



Fall is here, Village of Port Edwards Residents. I hope your Summer went well (as quick as it went) and you took advantage of the great weather we had here in central Wisconsin. Before we all start settling into our Fall and Winter routines, I want to take a few moments of your time.

The year is ¾ over and time is flying. The weather change is very inviting and I hope everyone takes advantage of the outdoor activities we have regionally.

We had some very successful events this summer with the Rummage sale, Fireman's dance, Lions Picnic and the Village Music fests. We look forward to planning for a few Fall and Winter events as well, more to follow.

We completed some major infrastructure projects this summer- 3<sup>rd</sup> street in our business district, the resurfacing of 4<sup>th</sup> street and the resurfacing of Port Road and Seneca Roads. We also be replaced over 1000' of sidewalk. These were all made possible by the small infrastructure fee (the \$35 cost that has been added to your vehicle registration fees), that all Villagers pay instead of special assessments, I am sure you will all agree that a small annual fee outweighs the past costs ranging into the thousands of dollars per resident for repair work conducted impacting your property.

We continued to improve our Parks with new facilities in the bathrooms, updating the heating and air systems and other small improvements to keep them pristine and the best they can be. Also, we will continue our dialogue with the NEPCO lake residents planning for the Boundary agreement to ending in 13 months. Those 200+ residents will return back to the Village and we hope to make that a seamless and positive transition.

Volunteer to help the Village when we ask, if you feel strongly get involved, you can help chart the course for the Village.


## Friends of the Monarchs

## **Port Edwards Water Utility Rates**

The Public Service Commission requires that water rates be published semi-annually. The following rates took effect on September 5, 2018:

#### **Quarterly Service Charge:**

Billing: Bills for water service are rendered quarterly and become due upon issuance following the period for which service is rendered. A late payment charge of 3 percent but not less than 50 cents will be added to bills not paid within 20 days of issuance. This one-time 3 percent late payment charge will be applied to any unpaid balance for the current billing period's usage. This late payment charge is applicable to all customers. The utility customer may be given a written notice that the bill is overdue no sooner than 20 days after the bill is issued, and unless payment or satisfactory arrangement for payment is made within the next ten days, service may be disconnected pursuant to Chapter PSC 185, WI Admin. Code.

#### Water & Sewer Billings

Water and sewer billings are quarterly, the 1<sup>st</sup> of January, April, July, and October with the bills due 20 days later. After late notices are sent out you have ten days to pay or your water will be shut off. If your water has been shut off, there is a \$20.00 reconnect charge. Water bills can be paid at the Municipal Building from 8:00 a.m. - Noon and 1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m., dropped in the silver payment box in front of the Municipal Building, or mailed in.



#### **Garbage and Recycling**

Please remember to place your weekly garbage and bi-weekly recyclables out for curbside pickup by 6:00 AM each day of pickup. Recycle pickup is every other week on your regular garbage day. LOOSE GARBAGE MUST BE PUT IN BAGS BEFORE PLACING IN CONTAINER!! Please note that pizza boxes are not recyclable. If you experience less than satisfactory service, please give us a call at the Municipal Building, 715-887-3512. After collection, containers shall be removed

from the curb or roadside (including alleys) within 12 hours.


