coming to our aid in times of crisis, these individuals keep our village running day in and day out, and I greatly appreciate all of what they do.


I hope you all have a great summer and I hope to see you supporting our village events! Whether it be Music in the Park or ball games in the park, make sure you take in the beauty of summer!

For those who do not know me, I am Officer Brandon Abbott. I have been employed at the Port Edwards PD for almost 5 years. I am currently working on a new program that will help the village in many different capacities. I was gifted this cute little guy we have named "Bosco" from local breeder, Dawnies Doodles. I am currently working with the Port Edwards School District and the Village Board to implement a Therapy/Search & Rescue program.





Bosco is a Goldendoodle and is almost 3 months old. He will go to training with me and will be certified as a therapy dog when he turns 1 year old. After that, he will get trained in Search & Rescue. Some of the highlighted areas we will use Bosco in are the High School, Grade School, Churches, and other social events along with Search & Rescue calls of service.

Leaf, Grass and Brush Pickup

On a weekly basis, the crew will pick up grass that is properly placed. Typically grass pickup is on Mondays and Tuesdays. Brush will be picked up on the same week as recycling.

All brush and grass must be placed <u>on the</u> <u>boulevard area behind the curb</u> making sure that there are no rocks or foreign objects in the piles. PLEASE NO BAGGING OF YARD WASTE!!

- Grass and leaves must be placed separate from brush.
- Brush must be stacked neatly with the cut end facing the street.
- Roots must be removed and placed separately from the branches.



If you need compost or wood chips, please contact the Municipal Building to arrange delivery of the material. Delivery is free to Village residents.

Sprinkling Restrictions

Lawn sprinkling restrictions begin on June 15th. Odd-numbered addresses will sprinkle on odd-numbered days and even-numbered addresses on even-numbered days. Likewise,



sprinkling is only allowed from 6:00 P.M. until 10:00 A.M. Please help conserve water by sprinkling during the early morning or evening hours.

Sprinkling restrictions end on September 15th.

Water & Sewer Billings

Water and sewer billings are quarterly, the 1st of January, April, July, and October with the bills

due 20 days later. If not paid on time, a 3% late fee will be added. After late notices are sent out you have ten days to pay or your water will be shut off. If your water has been shut off, there is a \$20.00 reconnect charge. Water bills can be paid at the Municipal Building from 8:00 A.M.-Noon and 1:00 P.M.-4:00 P.M., dropped in the payment box in front of the Municipal Building, or mailed in. You can also go to the Village website at <u>www.vi.portedwards.wi.gov</u> to make credit or debit card payments.

Garbage and Recycling

Please remember to place your weekly garbage and bi-weekly recyclables out for curbside pickup by **6:00 AM** each day of pickup. Recycle pickup is every other week



on your regular garbage day. <u>LOOSE</u> <u>GARBAGE MUST BE PUT IN BAGS BEFORE</u> <u>PLACING IN CONTAINER!!</u> Please note that <u>pizza boxes are not recyclable</u>. If you experience less than satisfactory service, please give us a call at the Municipal Building, 715-887-3512.

After collection, containers shall be removed from the curb or roadside (including alleys) within 12 hours.

<u>Cemetery Maintenance &</u> <u>Allowable Decorations</u>

The Village of Port Edwards takes great pride in the appearance and upkeep of the cemetery. The rules of the cemetery limit what can be placed for decorations. Only traditional flower plantings are allowed at the cemetery. Please be aware that if you have items that are not flowers (such as lights or other objects) they may be removed and disposed of. The Village asks that all people enjoying the cemetery abide by the rules established to keep the Port Edwards cemetery one of the nicest maintained in the region.

FROM THE DESK OF THE INTERIM VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR



Residents of The Village of Port Edwards. Like I stated in the last newsletter I am back as your Interim Administrator and only here for two days a week. Tuesday, or Thursday and try to schedule my days in Port Edwards when Committee's meet. I have lunch at El Café and have been meeting some residents to chat. Yes, Sandy looks me up to give me her two cents.

Interim Administrator just means that, I am now working with the Village Board in planning my departure, which will be December 1, 2024, right after setting the budget for 2025.

There are going to be some changes in staff in the Village. The Village is in the process of recruiting for new Fire Chief and we are getting new members in joining the Department too. The Police & Fire Commission (PFC) have been busy in attracting new members. It isn't official, but our beloved Police Chief has indicated he will be retiring sometime

between December 2024-February 2025. Once again PFC will be hard at it and new faces. As for the Administrator the Village Board will be looking at several alternatives for 2025. These are some of the alternatives they heard at the strategic and goalsetting meeting end of April:

- Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Administrator/Economic Development/Planning/Zoning Coordinator. Disadvantage, it is hard to find a qualified parson with this background & Village budget can't afford FTE in this position for the size of Port.
- Shared Administrator/Economic Development/Planning/Zoning Coordinator with another community i.e. Town of Rome or Grand Rapids. Disadvantage, it is hard to find a qualified parson with this background and trying to sever two communities at the same time.

- FTE Police Chief/Administrator. Disadvantage would need an FTE Community Resource Office (CRO) & FTE Police Chief/Administrator. No budget savings.
- No Administrator. Budget savings.
 - o Department heads run their departments report to Village Board
 - Department heads run their departments report to Village President Change the ordinance to provide the managerial powers to Village President.
 - Department heads run their departments Assign Department Head as lead manager of staff and report to Village Board.
 - Assign Department Head as Administrative Coordinator and reports to the Village Board.

All the above alternatives will require Ordinance changes and one will be flushed out over the next few months by Village Board and the Standing Committees. Some changes <u>must</u> occur the Village no long has the revenues to operate as is and inflation is driving up cost.

Some good news is the Village Tax Increment District (TID) is healthy (funds availed) and will be funding some major street & utility projects over the next few years. However, this revenue stream will dry up within five years.
