

Welcome to Summer, Village of Port Edwards Residents. I hope your Spring went well (as quick as it went) and you took advantage of the great weather we had here in central Wisconsin. Before we all start scattering to our summer adventures, I want to take a few moments of your time.

The year is half over and time is flying. The weather change is very inviting, and I hope everyone takes advantage of the outdoor activities we have regionally. We plan to conduct some local events in the Village with the Memorial Day Service at the cemetery, Firefighters' Athletic Association Annual Street Dance, PEBA Baseball/Softball Tournament, Nepco Lake 100th Anniversary and Lions Picnic. Village Transportation Survey

The Village is conducting a Transportation Survey to gather valuable feedback from residents about our local transportation needs and safety. This survey will help us improve the transportation infrastructure, making our village safer and more accessible for everyone.

A key focus of the survey is the Safe Routes to School initiative that we are starting with the North Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (NCWRPC). We're asking families and caregivers to share their thoughts on the safety of routes children take to school. Your responses will directly impact improvements to walking and biking paths, crosswalks, and traffic patterns near schools, ensuring that our kids can travel safely to and from school.

Whether you're a parent, pedestrian, cyclist, or driver, we want to hear from you! The survey will take about 5 minutes and is **open until June 8, 2025**.

Leaf, Grass and Brush Pickup

On a weekly basis, the crew will pick up grass that is properly placed. Typically grass pickup is on Mondays and Tuesdays. Brush will be picked up on the same week as recycling.

All brush and grass must be placed on the boulevard area <u>behind the curb</u> making sure that there are no rocks or foreign objects in the piles. PLEASE NO BAGGING OF YARD WASTE!!

- Grass and leaves must be placed separate from brush.
- Brush must be stacked neatly with the cut end facing the street.
- Roots must be removed and placed separately from the branches.

If you need compost or wood chips, please contact the Municipal Building to arrange delivery of the material. Delivery is free to Village residents.

Sprinkling Restrictions

Lawn sprinkling restrictions begin on June 15th. Odd-numbered addresses will sprinkle on odd-numbered days and even-numbered addresses on even-numbered days. Likewise, sprinkling is only allowed from 6:00 P.M. until 10:00 A.M. Please help conserve water by sprinkling during the early morning or evening

Sprinkling restrictions end on September 15th.

Water & Sewer Billings

Water and sewer billings are quarterly, on the 1st of January, April, July, and October with the bills

due 20 days later. If not paid on time, a 3% late fee will be added. After late notices are sent out you have ten days to pay or your water will be shut off. If your water has been shut off, there is a \$20.00 reconnect charge. Water bills can be paid at the Municipal Building from 8:00 A.M.-Noon and 1:00 P.M.-4:00 P.M., dropped in the payment box in front of the Municipal Building, or mailed in. You can also go to the Village website at www.vi.portedwards.wi.gov to make credit or debit card payments.

Garbage and Recycling

Please remember to place your weekly garbage and bi-weekly recyclables out for curbside pickup by 6:00 AM each day of pickup. Recycle pickup is every other week



on your regular garbage day. <u>LOOSE</u> <u>GARBAGE MUST BE PUT IN BAGS BEFORE</u> <u>PLACING IN CONTAINER!!</u> <u>Please note that pizza boxes are not recyclable</u>. If you experience less than satisfactory service, please give us a call at the Municipal Building, 715-887-3512.

After collection, containers shall be removed from the curb or roadside (including alleys) within 12 hours.

<u>Cemetery Maintenance &</u> Allowable Decorations

The Village of Port Edwards takes great pride in the appearance and upkeep of the cemetery. The rules of the cemetery limit what can be placed for decorations. Only traditional flower plantings are allowed at the cemetery. Please be aware that if you have items that are not flowers (such as lights or other objects) they may be removed and disposed of. The Village asks that all people enjoying the cemetery abide by the rules established to keep the Port Edwards cemetery one of the nicest maintained in the region.
